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



We have created a campus that includes academic support, accommodation, sports, culture and entertainment—everything you need.



South Western Sydney campus

With people from more than 150 countries calling Liverpool home, the UOW South Western Sydney campus is a culturally vibrant and welcoming place to study. The campus is located on Moore Street, in the heart of Liverpool. You can step out of the classroom and find yourself amongst a world of food, shopping and entertainment.



FOOD

COFFEE

TRANSPORT

Cycling – If you choose to cycle to class, Liverpool City Council offers a number of bike racks in its Dewsbury Lane carpark.



University Access Program - Wollongong, Batemans Bay, Bega, Shoalhaven, South Western Sydney, Southern Highlands and Southern Sydney

This course is FEE FREE at the South Western Sydney campus in 2021.

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The University Access Program (UAP) is a 14-week course to give you the fundamental skills and habits required for university study and maximise your chance of success. It is specifically designed for students who would like to start their academic journey or did not meet the entry requirements to study at UOW.

After successful completion of the course, you are guaranteed* entry to most UOW undergraduate bachelor degrees.

There are two streams of subjects available. You will be placed in the stream relevant to your chosen UOW degree:

Stream 1 - Humanities or

Stream 2 - Information Technology, Science, Health and Behavioural Science.

Completion of an additional subject (Enabling Mathematics) is also required for some UOW degree offers from Stream 2.

Please note: UOW Batemans Bay, Bega, Shoalhaven, South Western Sydney, Southern Highlands and Southern Sydney campuses only offer Stream 1 - Humanities.

DURATION:

One session (14 weeks) full time (nine hours per week), or parttime equivalent.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

- Stream 1 Minimum ATAR 35.
- Stream 2 Minimum ATAR 35, plus minimum 60% for Year 12 HSC Mathematics Standard 2.
- Non-ATAR applicants will be required to complete a basic literacy and numeracy online test to determine eligibility into the course.

If any of the above entry requirements are not met, applications will be assessed on a case-by-case basis taking into account the applicant's work and life experience.

GUARANTEED* ENTRY INTO UOW BACHELOR:

Successful completion of the UAP provides guaranteed* entry to most UOW undergraduate bachelor degrees. For a full list of UOW degrees with pathways from UAP, please contact us to discuss the UAP Pathway Streams to UOW Degrees. There are no pathways from this course into double degrees, four-year professional degrees, Law, Nutrition and Dietetics, Nursing, Education (except Education – The Early Years) or Economics and Finance. If you wish to enter into one of the above study areas, please contact us to discuss alternative pathways available.

University Entrance Certificate and Special Tertiary Entrance Program (School Leavers)

UAC Code 759000

All UEC and STEP students receive a Commonwealth Supported Place, with tuition fees funded by the Commonwealth Government. There are no student fees for either program.

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The University Entrance Certificate (UEC) and the Special Tertiary Entrance Program (STEP to UOW) are university preparation courses specifically designed for students who have not met the direct entry requirements for a UOW bachelor degree, or who did not receive an ATAR from their secondary schooling.

The STEP to UOW Program is specifically for students who have experienced disadvantage during their secondary school education.

There are four streams of subjects available in these courses. You will placed in the stream relevant to your chosen UOW degree:

Stream 1 - Arts, Business, Commerce, Humanities, Social Science; or

Stream 2 - Business Information Systems, Information Technology; or

Stream 3 - Computer Science, Engineering, Mathematics, Nuclear Science, Physics; or

Stream 4 - Health Science, Nutrition Science, Science.

You will develop study skills and habits, including time management, essay writing, group work and presentation skills, and become familiar with the academic standards and expectations at university.

Autumn Session (March) Spring Session (June) Summer Session (October)

CAMPUS:

UOW College Wollongong

DURATION:

Two sessions (14 weeks per session) full time (average three to four days per week), or part-time equivalent.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

- Stream 1 Minimum ATAR 35.
- Stream 2 and Stream 4 Minimum ATAR 35, plus minimum 60% for Year 12 HSC Mathematics Standard 2.
- Stream 3 Minimum ATAR 35, plus minimum 80% for Year 12 Mathematics Standard 2.

If the above entry requirements are not met, a course eligibility assessment will be conducted based on HSC subject results. Applicants who have not completed the HSC will be assessed on a case-by-case basis taking into account the applicant's work and life experience.

To be considered for entry into STEP to UOW, you also need to be able to demonstrate that your school studies have suffered hardship^ because of circumstances beyond your control.

The hardship criteria for STEP to UOW include one or more of the following:

- financial hardship;
- disrupted schooling; home and environment responsibilities;
- English language difficulty; or
- personal illness/ disability.

STEP to UOW applicants must:

- Submit a written application addressing the equity criteria listed above;
- Satisfy the academic entry requirements listed above; and
- Have completed Year 12 within the last 2 years. Applicants who have not completed Year 12 but have completed Year 11 are encouraged to apply.

UEC applicants must satisfy the academic entry requirements listed above only.

GUARANTEED* ENTRY INTO UOW BACHELOR:

Successful completion of either the UEC or STEP to UOW provides guaranteed* entry to most UOW undergraduate bachelor degrees. There are no pathways from these courses into double degrees, four-year professional degrees, Law, Nutrition and Dietetics, Nursing or Economics and Finance.

^ The categories of hardship and the required supporting documentation for STEP to UOW applications are outlined in the application form and are similar to the UAC (Universities Admissions Centre) Educational Access Scheme (EAS). Students who have submitted EAS applications are encouraged to apply for STEP to UOW.

Diploma of Business

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The Diploma of Business is an in-depth preparation program which provides guaranteed* entry into the second year of a Bachelor of Business or Bachelor of Commerce at UOW.

The development of tertiary skills is embedded in all subjects in the Diploma of Business, which prepares you for successful participation in the second year of the degree. The diploma places an emphasis on a range of oral, written and presentation skills, including group work.

INTAKES:

Autumn Session (March) Spring Session (June) Summer Session (October)

CAMPUS:

UOW College Wollongong: Intakes in Autumn, Spring, Summer Sessions.

UOW College South Western Sydney: Intake in Autumn Session only.

DURATION:

Two sessions (14 weeks per session) full time, or part-time equivalent

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

Minimum ATAR 45.

If the above entry requirements are not met, a course eligibility assessment will be conducted based on HSC subject results. Applicants who have not completed the HSC will be assessed on a case-by-case basis taking into account the applicant's work and life experience.

GUARANTEED* ENTRY INTO UOW BACHELOR:

If you achieve a final mark of at least 50 per cent in all subjects of the Diploma of Business you will receive 48 credit points (entry to second year) towards a Bachelor of Business or Bachelor of Commerce offered at all UOW campuses (excluding the UOW Sydney CBD Campus).

A recognised Higher Education Diploma qualification is awarded upon completion which can be used to pursue entry level career opportunities.

Diploma of Engineering

UAC Code 759050

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The Diploma of Engineering is an in-depth preparation program designed to provide a guaranteed* pathway into the second year of a Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) at UOW. The program of study involves first-year core engineering subjects, which include theoretical and practical units, and hands-on experience. You will also develop tertiary academic skills in preparation for study at UOW. Elective subjects provide an opportunity to explore various engineering disciplines.

Autumn Session (March)

CAMPUS:

UOW College Wollongong

DURATION:

Two sessions (14 weeks per session) full time, or part-time equivalent

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

Minimum ATAR 60, plus minimum 50% in Year 12 HSC Mathematics Advanced and Physics.

If the above entry requirements are not met, a course eligibility assessment will be conducted based on HSC subject results. Applicants who have not completed the HSC will be assessed on a case-by-case basis taking into account the applicant's work and life experience.

GUARANTEED* ENTRY INTO UOW BACHELOR:

If you achieve a final mark of at least 50 per cent in all subjects of the Diploma of Engineering, you will receive 48 credit points (entry to second year) towards a Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) at UOW.

A recognised Higher Education Diploma qualification is awarded upon completion which can be used to pursue entry level career opportunities.

This course is jointly delivered by the University of Wollongong and UOW College.

Diploma of Information Technology

UAC Code 7590100 Wollongong UAC Code 7590350 South Western Sydney

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The Diploma of Information Technology (IT) provides a guaranteed* pathway into the second year of a Bachelor of Information Technology, Bachelor of Business Information Systems, or Bachelor of Computer Science at UOW.

The Diploma of IT covers a range of information systems, information technology and business topics and will help you build skills for a future in IT. Tertiary skills development embedded in the Diploma of IT also prepares you for successful participation at UOW.

INTAKES:

Autumn Session (March) Spring Session (June) Summer Session (October)

CAMPUS:

UOW College Wollongong: Intakes in Autumn, Spring, Summer Sessions.

UOW College South Western Sydney: Intake in Autumn Session only.

DURATION:

Two sessions (14 weeks per session) full time, or part-time equivalent

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

Minimum ATAR 55, plus minimum 60% in Year 12 HSC Mathematics Standard 2.

If the above entry requirements are not met, a course eligibility assessment will be conducted based on HSC subject results. Applicants who have not completed the HSC will be assessed on a case-by-case basis taking into account the applicant's work and life experience.

GUARANTEED* ENTRY INTO UOW BACHELOR:

If you achieve a final mark of at least 50 per cent in all subjects of the Diploma of IT, you will receive 48 credit points (entry to second year) towards a Bachelor of Information Technology, Bachelor of Business Information Systems, or Bachelor of Computer Science at UOW.

A recognised Higher Education Diploma qualification is awarded upon completion which can be used to pursue entry level career opportunities.

Diploma of Medical and Health Sciences

UAC Code 759055

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The Diploma of Medical and Health Sciences offers a comprehensive foundation in chemical and biological sciences where students gain an understanding of applied sciences, including the anatomical, molecular and physiological processes of human health and function.

Students are provided with a range of learning experiences and opportunities in science discipline-based subjects which provide students with the experience of working in University of Wollongong (UOW) science laboratories. Students are provided with dedicated support tutorials to prepare them for success in their university studies.

Autumn Session (March)

CAMPUS:

UOW College Wollongong

DURATION:

Two sessions (14 weeks per session) full time, or part-time equivalent

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

Minimum ATAR 60.

If the above entry requirements are not met, a course eligibility assessment will be conducted based on HSC subject results. Applicants who have not completed the HSC will be assessed on a case-by-case basis taking into account the applicant's work and life experience.

GUARANTEED* ENTRY INTO UOW BACHELOR:

If you achieve a final mark of at least 50 per cent in all subjects in the Diploma of Medical and Health Sciences, you will receive 48 credit points (entry to the second year) towards the Bachelor of Medical and Health Sciences, the Bachelor of Nutrition Science, or the Bachelor of Exercise Science offered at UOW's Wollongong campus.

A recognised Higher Education Diploma qualification is awarded upon completion which can be used to pursue entry level career opportunities.

This course is jointly delivered by the University of Wollongong and UOW College.

Diploma of Science

UAC Code 7590400

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The Diploma of Science is an in-depth preparation program which provides a guaranteed* pathway into the second year of a Bachelor of Science at UOW. It is designed to empower you to apply scientific thinking and analysis to important issues impacting the world today. You will learn the language and nature of science and mathematics, and will be able to follow your interests in specific areas of science. Tertiary skills development embedded in the Diploma of Science prepares you for successful participation at UOW, with an emphasis on a range of practical laboratory and written work, including group work.

Autumn Session (March)

CAMPUS:

UOW College Wollongong

DURATION:

Two (14 weeks per session) full time, or part-time equivalent

Scholarships and funding

Smart & Skilled government funding^{*}

To be eligible for Smart and Skilled government subsidised training with UOW College, you will need to meet all of the following criteria:

- I5 years old or over: AND
- no longer at school: AND
- living or working in NSW: AND
- an Australian citizen, Australian permanent resident, Australian permanent humanitarian visa holder or New Zealand citizen.

If you are eligible for Smart and Skilled funding, and satisfy additional concession criteria, you may also be eligible for a for a Smart and Skilled fee-free scholarship which means you will not have to pay any portion of the fees.

SMART AND SKILLED FEE-FREE SCHOLARSHIPS AND GOVERNMENT SUBSIDISED PLACES

The NSW Government's Smart and Skilled Fee-Free Scholarships mean that you can obtain the skills you need for the job you want and your course fees are covered. Fee-Free Scholarships are intended to help people (15-30 years old) who are concession-eligible to undertake training under Smart and Skilled. All Certificate III and Certificate IV level qualifications at UOW College are approved for Smart and Skilled funding, including Traineeship delivery.

HAVE AN EXISTING QUALIFICATION? YOU MAY BE ELIGIBLE TO ACCESS SUBSIDISED TRAINING

If you meet the personal eligibility criteria for Smart and Skilled, you will have access to training entitlements regardless of the level of any previous qualifications held. This investment supports the Government's Reskilling NSW Strategy aimed at helping people who gained their higher level qualifications previously or from overseas, who require minimal re-training in order to enter, or re-enter, the workforce.

SMART AND SKILLED TRAINEESHIPS

Traineeships combine work-based training with an employer and formal training from a training provider and are a great way to be paid for work, learn and earn a qualification. You may be eligible to apply for a subsidised traineeship under the NSW Government's Smart and Skilled funding initiative. The subsidy is available to trainees who are new entrants, but not those who are existing workers. Your employer can confirm your trainee category. As a new entrant trainee, you are eligible for a government subsidy for your traineeship qualification, even if you already have a Certificate IV or higher qualification. If you have completed a traineeship at school, this will not affect your eligibility for Smart and Skilled subsidised training after you leave school. If you're starting your training with your training provider in a subsidised traineeship, your Smart and Skilled student fee for the whole qualification will not be more than \$1,000.

Indigenous Scholarships

The UOW College Australia Indigenous Scholarship provides financial support to eligible Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students to assist recipients to achieve their educational goals.

Every eligible student will be awarded a full fee-paying scholarship to the value of the standard tuition fee, as applicable at the time of course commencement, for the selected UOW College Australia program.[^]

All UOW College courses are eligible for the Scholarship.

The Scholarship is applicable at all UOW campuses where UOW College courses are offered.

Applicants must satisfy the following eligibility criteria to be considered for a UOW College Australia Indigenous Scholarship:

- Be an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander person (a certified Confirmation of Aboriginality or a signed Statutory Declaration attesting that you meet all the elements of the definition must be provided to satisfy this criterion); and,
- Have an offer of admission to a UOW College Australia course commencing in 2021; and,
- Complete the Indigenous Scholarship application form in full; and,
- Successfully demonstrate an appropriate academic record or commitment to study and explain how the course will be used to advance your studies and/or career in the future at time of application and at interview.

Commonwealth Supported Place

A Commonwealth supported place (CSP) is government subsidy where the government pays part or all of a student's fees. A CSP is not a loan and is not required to be paid back.

All students enrolled in the University Entrance Certificate and STEP to UOW program receive a full CSP and are not required to pay a student contribution.

CSPs will also be available to eligible domestic students enrolled in Higher Education Diploma and Undergraduate Certificate courses; a student contribution will also apply for these courses.

CSPs are available for Australian and New Zealand citizens and holders of an Australian permanent visa (including humanitarian).

Student loans

FEE-HELP

FEE-HELP is an Australian Government income contingent loan scheme that is part of the Higher Education Loan Program (HELP). FEE-HELP assists eligible students pay their tuition fees and is available for the University Access Program.

HECS-HELP

HECS-HELP is an Australian Government income contingent loan scheme that is part of the Higher Education Loan Program (HELP). VET STUDENT LOANS (VSL)*

VET Student Loans is an Australian Government loan program that is available to assist eligible students enrolled in approved Vocational Education and Training (VET) Diploma level (or above) qualifications, at approved course providers, pay their tuition fees subject to a maximum loan amount. Students can only access VSL for approved courses offered by approved course providers. UOW College is an approved VET Student Loans provider. VET Student Loans is available at UOW College for eligible students for

- HLT54115 Diploma of Nursing
- CUA51015 Diploma of Screen and Media
- CUA60615 Advanced Diploma of Screen and Media

A VET Student Loan will not be approved for a student who does not meet eligibility requirements. A VET Student Loan gives rise to a VETSL debt that continues to be a debt due to the Commonwealth until it is repaid. Please refer to the UOW College or Study Assist websites for more information.
