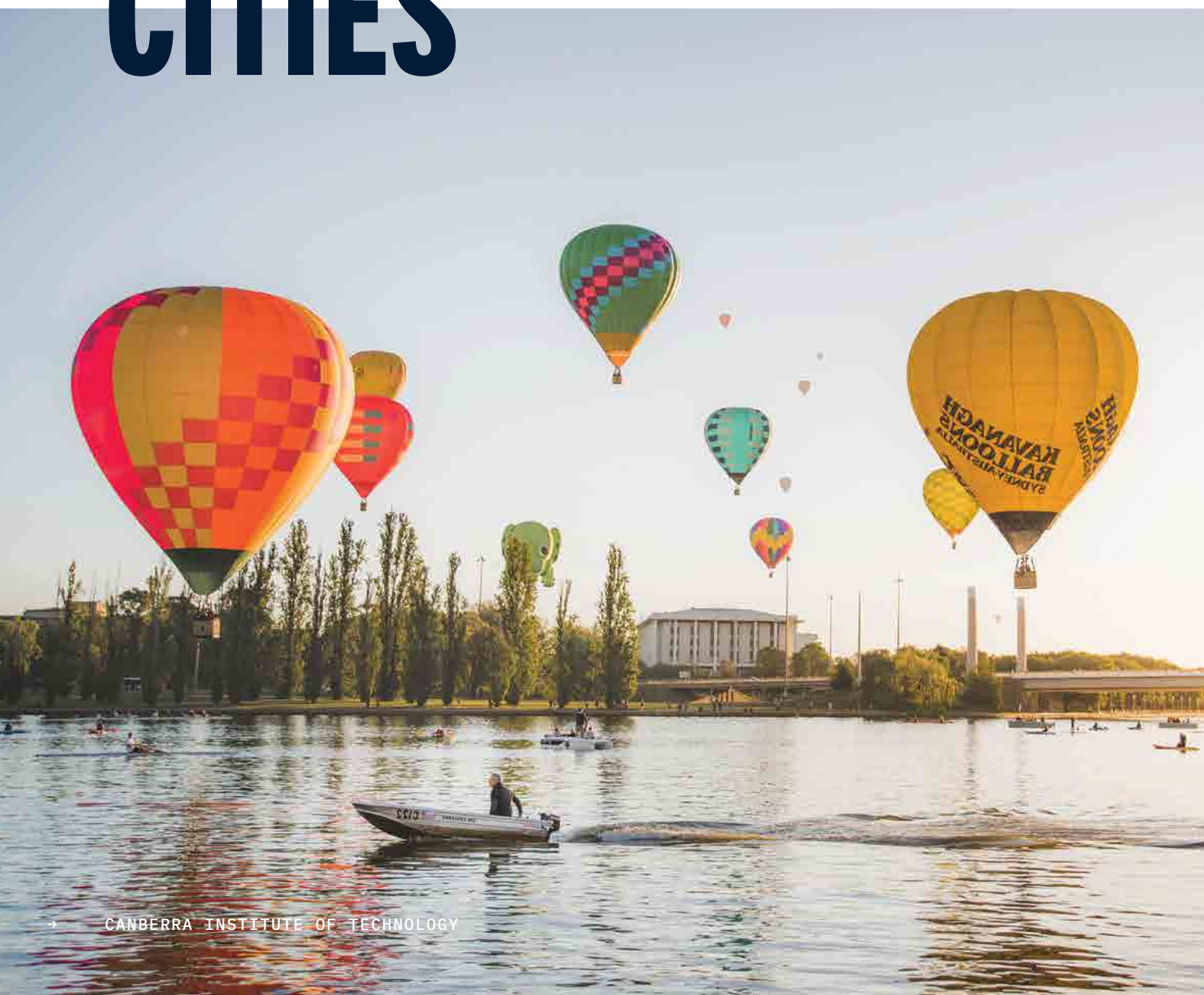

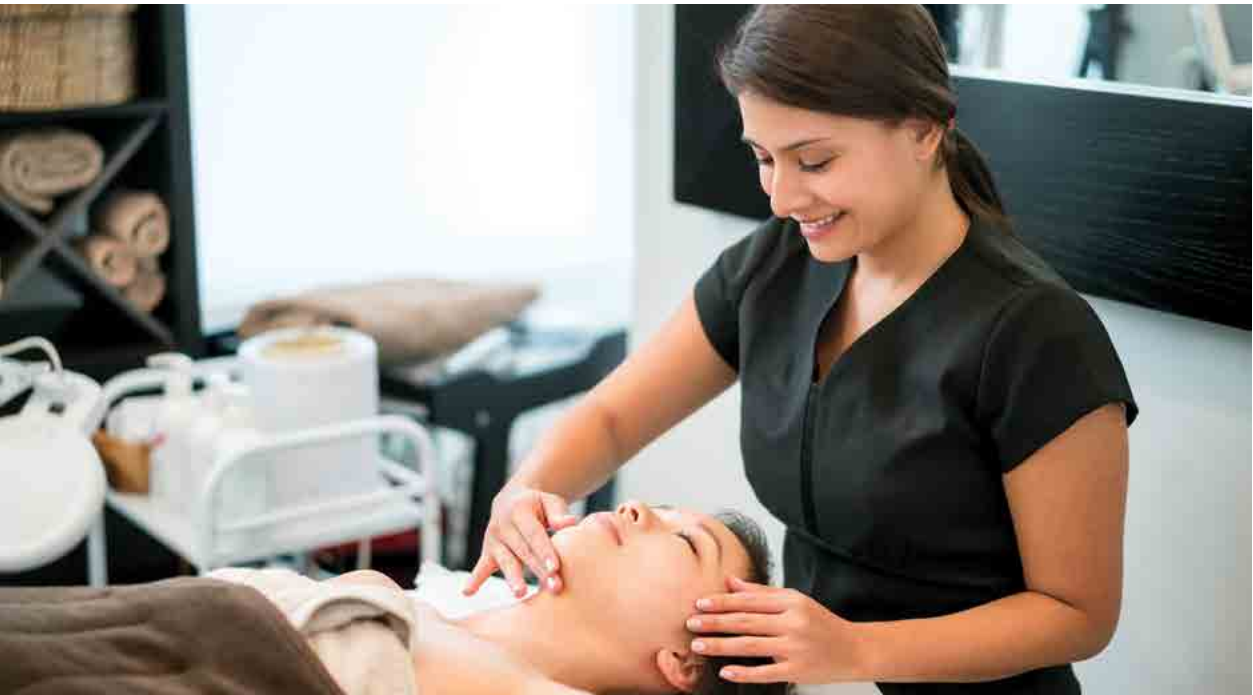

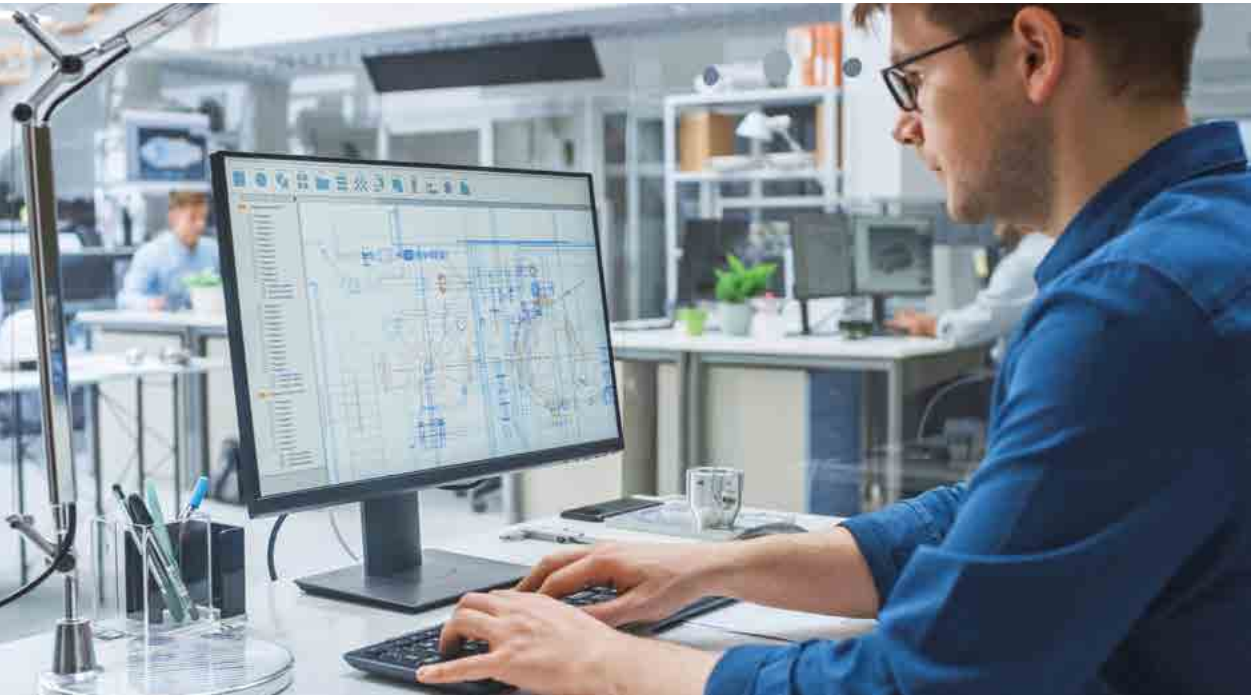

STUDENTS FOCUS ON LEADING SUSTAINABILITY IN BUSINESS

Job opportunities in sustainability are growing as businesses place greater emphasis on reducing global greenhouse emissions and addressing the challenges of climate change.

An increased demand for laboratory and pathology testing due to the COVID-19 pandemic saw an increase in pathology job opportunities in Canberra. Several CIT students who have studied laboratory techniques have been offered graduate positions with well-known ACT pathology companies.

Laura Henry, Science and Laboratory Skills Coordinator, said the course provides experience in performing routine pathology tasks and laboratory techniques, which is experiencing strong demand with COVID-19 testing.

"The focus of this certificate is to give students the skills needed to work as a technical officer in a pathology laboratory. Career opportunities include a variety of departments within pathology laboratories, biochemistry, haematology, microbiology and histology technical officers."

Laura explained that a great variety of students are attracted to this course.

"We have some students with university degrees who are looking for more hands-on practical training. We also have students retraining to change career paths or high school graduates using this as a step before a university degree."

"Entry-level positions are often advertised and have quite high turnovers, as staff are frequently moving out of entry level and into specialised roles, or further study," she said.

SPARK PROGRAM LEADS TO HOSPITALITY JOBS

Young people have received valuable training in hospitality skills and jobs with ClubsACT through the innovative Spark training program at CIT.

CIT, in partnership with Spark and ClubsACT, delivered an accredited JobTrainer program focusing on skills development, work experience and employment within the licenced club industry.

JobTrainer, jointly funded by the ACT and Australian Government, has resulted in strong interest from participants and industry. Nineteen participants completed the training before they undertook work placements in local licensed clubs.

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HOW TO ENROL

CIT offers a range of qualifications, from certificates to advanced diplomas, and apprenticeships and traineeships. Once you know what you'd like to study, you will need to apply for your course.



PREPARE TO STUDY

Do you have all your documents and information required to enrol? Ensure you have everything you need before applying at CIT, such as:

- Does your course require a language, literacy and numeracy skills (LLN) assessment?
- Do you need to meet with a CIT careers advisor or student support advisor?
- Can your skills be recognised through CIT skills recognition to gain either part of or full qualification?

Check out the CIT enrolment information page - it provides an overview of all the information you may require before enrolling at CIT.

DO YOU HAVE A UNIQUE STUDENT IDENTIFIER (USI)?

It is a requirement that all new and continuing CIT students who are registering into any nationally-recognised vocational education and training (VET) course in Australia (or overseas from an Australian-registered provider) have a Unique Student Identifier— you cannot enrol or graduate without one. Don't have one? Visit usi.gov.au to apply securely online, at no cost.

Already have one from previous study? You will need to verify it in CIT Self Service.

APPLYING FOR YOUR COURSE

Once you have selected your course, you can APPLY to study the course via the CIT website.

To apply, select your course, taking note of the 'enrolment type' as you will need to refer to this later.

ENROLLING INTO YOUR SUBJECTS

Most courses automatically accept students once an application has been completed. You now need to ENROL into your subjects. To enrol you will either:

- attend an on-campus or virtual enrolment session - enrolment will be either paper-based or online
- enrol online - to do this you will need the class reference numbers (CRNs). These are available either in the course information on the CIT website or are provided to you by the teacher.

Note: Some courses allow you to enrol at any time - follow the directions on the course information page on the CIT website. After enrolling you will be issued with a student invoice outlining your course fees and the date they are due for payment.

ONCE YOU'VE ENROLLED

Once you've successfully enrolled, make sure you read through and regularly visit the enrolment information page.

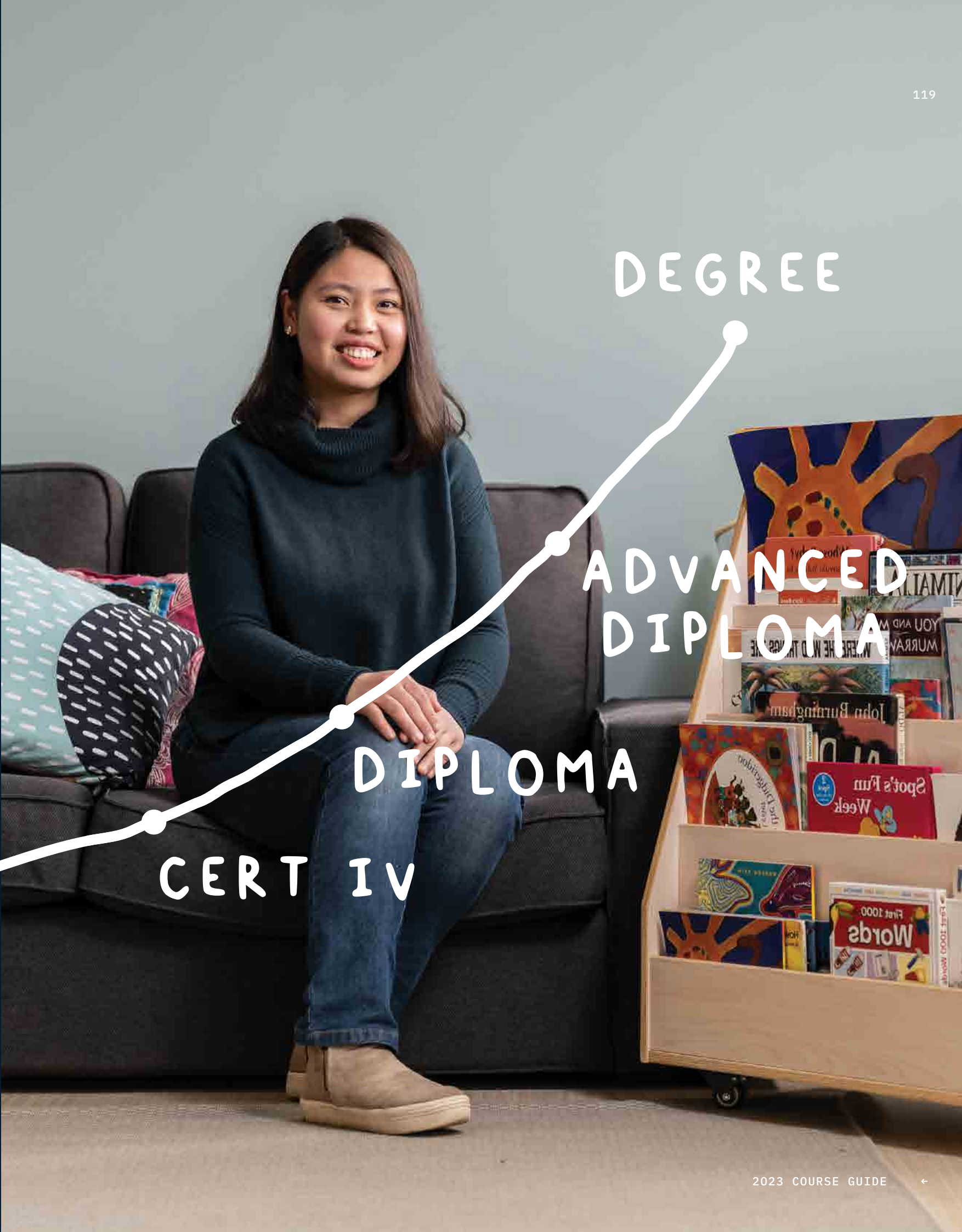

APPRENTICESHIPS, TRAINEESHIPS AND ASbAs

Get straight into the workforce and gain skills on the job with an apprenticeship or traineeship.

WHAT ARE AUSTRALIAN APPRENTICESHIPS, TRAINEESHIPS AND ASbAs?

The term Australian Apprenticeship refers to a unique style of training which combines paid work and structured vocational training. Australian Apprenticeships include apprenticeships, Australian School-based Apprenticeships (ASbAs) and traineeships. This type of training allows you to learn a trade or workplace skills and receive a nationally-accredited qualification at the same time.

ASbAs are for secondary students aged 15 years and over. You can earn a wage working with an employer and train towards an accredited qualification at a registered training organisation while still going to school.

Pre-apprenticeship courses give you a taste for work in a specific industry and help you prepare for a formal apprenticeship. Unlike an Australian Apprenticeship, you don't need to have an employer to start these courses.

IN WHICH INDUSTRY AREAS DOES CIT TRAIN APPRENTICES AND TRAINEES?

Australian Apprenticeships are available in an increasing range of industries.

Apprenticeships and ASbAs usually cover 'traditional' trades such as carpentry, construction, electrical, hairdressing, landscaping, plumbing and many more.

Traineeships provide training in vocational areas not usually covered by apprenticeships and are available across a range of careers. These include business administration, aged care, children's education, dental, disability, hospitality, mental health and many more.

HOW DO I BECOME AN APPRENTICE OR TRAINEE?

①

Find an employer who's willing to take you on as an apprentice, trainee or ASbA.

②

Contact the ACT Apprenticeship Network Provider (ANP).

③

Meet with the ANP to sign your Australian Apprenticeship Training Contract within 28 days of starting employment.

④

Meet with CIT to enrol in your qualification and discuss your training plan. Your training plan sets out how and when your training and assessments are conducted in order for you to achieve your qualification.

COURSE FEES



FEES

CIT is the largest provider of vocational education and training (VET) in the ACT and charges the relevant fees associated with study. These student fees are complex, and may change often, so it is important that you take moment to familiarise yourself with the options you have in your chosen course of study.

Student fees are complex because they include tuition fees and some (not all) resources and other materials fees. Different courses require different periods of study, so tuition fees will differ by course. Some tuition fees are subsidised by government (Australian, state and territory) and some are not.

Some courses may have capped places available, which means only a certain number of people may make use of the applicable government subsidy. Student fees often change because these subsidies change. This means student fees may not be the same one year to another, which can make comparisons difficult. Each course listed on the CIT website will have an indicative cost, which can vary based on electives, duration and financial assistance.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

GST

GST of 10% applies to some fees, for example, the course materials fee, where the item acquired becomes your property and is usable after the course completion. Basic tuition fees are GST free.

SKILLS RECOGNITION

WHAT IS SKILLS RECOGNITION?

Skills Recognition is an acknowledgement of the skills you have learned from your work, from life experience or from previous formal study.

RECOGNISING YOUR WORK AND LIFE EXPERIENCE

As you travel through life, you gather a variety of skills and a vast amount of knowledge which can be recognised formally against a qualification. You can gather experience if you:

- are currently working
- have worked in the past
- are raising a family
- are participating in social, recreational or educational activities
- are involved in a hobby or are volunteering in your community.

RECOGNISING YOUR PREVIOUS FORMAL STUDY

CIT also recognises subjects or competencies you have successfully obtained through another accredited vocational educational institution.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF SKILLS RECOGNITION?

Skills Recognition means you don't have to study things you already know. It makes study more enticing, more enjoyable, more relevant and less time consuming.

DO I HAVE TO PAY FOR SKILLS RECOGNITION?

Fees may apply. If fees are charged they are usually charged at the same rate as the subject fee.
